A Christmas Message from Rev. Dr. Bill Smith, Lead Minister

Dear Friends:

This week, one of my neighbours lit up their home with coloured lights, complete with an inflatable Santa on the front lawn. While, at time writing, no snow lay on the ground, the lights are a clear sign that Christmas is just around the corner. Check out the Shopping Centres, the Santa Claus Parades, and the television advertisements. Yes, ready or not, here it comes!

Ready or not ... how we get ready for Christmas is as much about mindset as it is about planning and shopping and hanging coloured lights. And the first part of readiness is the decision about how we are going to usher in and celebrate Christmas this year. There has been an interesting debate going on in church circles around Christmas 2011. You see, Christmas day, December 25, falls on a Sunday. Imagine, with our two Christmas Eve services, that means three services in less than 15 hours. That is enough to send shivers up the spine of even the most regular churchgoer. Some have even suggested that we should cancel the Sunday service. After all, we would not want Jesus to get in the way of Christmas ... or would we? In answer to this, two of our neighbouring churches, St. Matthew's & College Hill, will be coming to "our house" this Christmas with a joint worship service at 10:30 a.m. Then, in turn, we will be going to one of theirs on New Year's Day (stay tuned for location). Isn't that what families do in the holiday season? They come together to celebrate the gift of family and the gift of community, as we hold up that precious gift from God. Many families have Christmas traditions, wonderful celebrations held year after year. Some will be travelling to the homes of family and friends, while others will serve as hosts. These celebrations are important and highly anticipated each year. But, if you are able, this year, I invite you to share in a "new tradition"; the Christmas morning tradition; the "bring your favourite present to Church" tradition; the "Jesus in the Manger rather than under the tree" tradition. It doesn't happen very often (2016, 2022, 2033, 2039, 2044 and 2050), but when it does, it reminds us of what this "festive holiday" is all about ... *for unto us is born this day, a Saviour who is Christ the Lord.*

I invite you to read this *Banner* and take part in all the celebrations -- from Advent Communion to Christmas Adventures and White Gift; from Organ Recitals and a wonderful Christmas Cantata to our Congregational Christmas Party, and then turn to the Holy Night, to the Carols at 7 p.m. and the cup and bread at 10:30 p.m., and then, if you are able, double-dip in worship on Christmas day with our friends from College Hill and St. Matthew's, For isn't this really what it's all about?!

See you with your favourite present on Christmas day.

The Advent Season is fast approaching and the musical activities of the season are revving up. On December 1, 8, 15, (Thursdays) from 12:15-12:45 there will be free noon recitals of Advent/Christmas music. Generally the list exceeds our budget, especially so these last few years when we are all experiencing budget constraints. There always seems to be so much more that needs to be done than there is time or funding. It’s also a time to look back at what we have accomplished this past year – replacement of the flat roof over the Christian Education/Gym wing, repairs to the slate roof after a wind storm, maintenance of the front stone steps, interior and exterior painting, the installation of our new “Barrier Free Personal Lift”, to name a few.

From all of us on the P & F Division, we wish you the very best this Christmas season.

***Treasurer's Input ...***

Recently, Rev. Bill Smith gave an excellent Sunday message on Stewardship, and this was followed up with comments to the congregation from Rick McKee, our Stewardship Division Chair. The following comments are from your Treasurer.

We are pleased to report an improvement in the financial position since the publication of the *Thanksgiving Banner*. At that time, we reported an Operating Deficit of \$25,300 and an Overall Deficit of \$30,400 after a shortfall in funding for the roof repair. As of October 31, the Operating Deficit has decreased to \$15,900 resulting from your support and an increase in the investment income through the Board of Trustees. However, there remains a deficit that hopefully will decrease to a balanced budget position at December 31. The offerings to October 31 of \$210,500 are \$8,700 lower than the same period in 2010. On the assumption that the offerings will be the same as last year, we are optimistic that we will reach a balance position, as congregational financial support usually increases in the last two months of the year. Also, your Congregational Board has been scrupulous in its expenditures, as no funds have been spent unless absolutely necessary.

The Barrier Free Lift is now operational. The overall cost of engineering support, the actual lift, and the installation, totaling \$115,500, has been financed through a generous gift from the Parrott Foundation.

There have been preliminary discussions that the funds will be applied to a specific longer term identifiable project
