<u>INN FROM THE COLD (IFTC)</u> (our winter program) serves hot, freshly prepared, nutritious meals (soup, salad, entree, vegetables, dessert) each evening of operation – **middle of January to the end of February each year**. This program is intended to provide assistance during the coldest time of the winter when heating & electrical costs eat away at funds that would otherwise be used for groceries. No registration is required.

Doors open at 4 p.m.

Hot soup and coffee is served @ 4:30.

Dinner is served from 5 to 6:30 p.m.

If unable to come to the church at this time, you can pick up frozen meals, <u>daily</u>, between 2 and 4 pm. For this component of our winter meal program, you will need to register on your first visit by showing ID for the number of meals you wish to pick up.
