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OUR CHOIR RETURNS...

Ever since BSUC's premises were closed to non-essential staff and volunteers, as per the provincial Emergency Order, our Music Director, Mitchell Cox, has been working online with both the voice and handbell choirs.

This Sunday's worship will include the voice choir's recording of Per Crucem, the lyrics of which translate from Latin to English as "By Your cross and passion, deliver us, O Lord."

From Mitchell's introductory note: "In typical Latin religious music, there are few words... repeated in different ways."

We are fortunate indeed that our worship will be enhanced by the choir's contribution; thank you to all who were involved.



INSIGHTS INTO ONLINE WORSHIP...

At its Zoom meeting on May 12th, the Transition Team had conversation about the offering of worship in a format never utilized before at BSUC.

Noting that the YouTube platform was new to him too, Rev. David shared some of the delights and the challenges that accompany this new approach to leading and presenting worship.

Chief among his observations regarded how appreciative worshippers were for the chance to gather in community and to be focused on faith. Others commented on Mitchell Cox's lovely music, David's spiritual messages, and the array of images that add visual appeal.


Of the challenges, David highlighted the additional time required per week. Whereas preparing the liturgy, drafting his sermon, and leading 'in person' worship usually accounts for 15 hours a week, now that number has climbed to 20 hours, in part because of the tasks relating to 'taping' content.


David further offered that while there is much that he and Mitchell are able to provide (and are learning to do even more), uniting the various video and audio clips into a whole must be done by an individual with that specific competence. Indeed, image editing, sound mastering, and broadcast optimization require a high degree of expertise. Given this, external help has been retained.

Costs are being kept very low as both Mitchell and David have outside 'sources' who are willing to support charitable enterprises.

The fee for post-production video work is \$100 per Sunday; the audio editing and track overlaying related to this Sunday's choir piece will cost an additional \$100. These figures represent a deep discount when compared to what the marketplace presently commands. We are very fortunate to have folks who will perform this quality of work at a such a reduced rate.

To quote David, "As of this Sunday, Bridge Street Church will have produced 5 ever-improving weekly videoed worship experiences; I believe they are supporting a lot of people on their spiritual journey; our videos are generating between 100 and 216 views on YouTube... That's awesome outreach! I think it's certainly worth the time and investment."

Sometimes the local church becomes aware of life-events that call for our prayers in support of fellow parishioners.


And so we do!
