Last week you heard at the beginning of the service our singing of "Per Crucem".

That was the culmination of much practicing of parts at home, as well as online rehearsals. Then, after sending out an accompaniment to the choristers, they recorded themselves singing at home, and then sent that recording back to me.

Next, I sent these components electronically for editing to a third party.

I want to thank everyone in the voice choir and bell choir for their patience and understanding at this time. We are working with different programs that will only become easier for us to use the more we work with them.

One result of using a new piece of technology called "A Capella" is the piece you will hear this Sunday.

It was recorded by myself and mezzo soprano, Kathryn Humphries, who lives in Victoria. She is an extremely talented operatic singer, and also plays harp. I am so thankful for her willingness to participate in our services.

As I was listening to worship last Sunday, it dawned on me that some of you may not know that if you listen with headphones or earbuds, the sound quality improves exponentially - especially for the quality of music, but also for listening to David and the reader. You may wish to try this.

Finally, as a personal past time, I have been recording various hymns and posting them to YouTube. Search "Mitchell Cox Hymns From Home" to locate them, and enjoy!
