A REPORT FROM THE COMMUNITY CONNECTIONS TEAM

Knitters United (KU)

This much appreciated group continues to produce knitted objects of many uses and for many destinations and for many persons.

During COVID-19, knitters access wool supplies while appropriately distanced in Elizabeth Ewashkiw's driveway.

Although some finished products are stored at knitters' homes now, two projects in pandemic time have become offered to those who are in some degree of need.

In partnership with the Belleville & Quinte West Community Health Centre, a CHC staffer puts together care packages for seniors in need, which contain knitted necessities.

For the comfort of Hastings Manor residence, KU is knitting individual Izzy Dolls for residents' comfort. (The dolls are named after MCpl Mark Isfeld of the Canadian Forces [killed peacekeeping in 1994], who first gave them to war-distressed children). See the photo below of the Izzy Dolls created by KU.

A pattern of "caring for the other" within KU is a frequent, valued, and, on occasion, indispensable, offering outside "needle hours".

We are so fortunate to have such dedicated knitters and leadership.

United Syrian Family Support of Belleville

The four families and grandparents who arrived in Canada between 2015 and 2017 with the United Syrian Family Support (Belleville) support group remain well.

The first family is awaiting the date of its Canadian Citizenship ceremony; the other 3 families and grandparents have all submitted assessment requests for entrance to their citizenship exam.

All families and grandparents are financially self-sufficient, with employment continuing to date in the pandemic.

The children all continue to advance annually in school; the two oldest have led the way to academic success; one has successfully completed first year biotechnology at Loyalist College; the other will be graduating from high school this spring.



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Meal Programs

On March 27th, all existing no cost/low cost lunch offerings in Belleville were suspended given concern over COVID-19.

The BSUC Meal Program responded by developing a daily noon hour meal for the duration of the acute pandemic response.

As at May 22nd, 3693 takeaway lunches with hot soup, a freshly-made sandwich, hand-held homemade dessert, milk or water or fruit juice, and a piece of fruit have been distributed to those with need of meal support; the team has also given out 688 additional lunches through Grace Inn and the Not Alone Team.

A total of **4,381** lunches have been distributed in the 54 days since March 27th.



Homeless Project

The federal grant-funded project continues to be active (funded to 31 March 2024), as Community Connections Team personnel plan inter-agency coordination and integration among organizations working in the homeless sector in Belleville and in Hastings County.

Because of pandemic social distancing requirements, we (and our Calgary-based partners) have become dependent upon technology for convening meetings and for offering awareness sessions.
