A PASTORAL LETTER

Friends of Bridge Street United Church,

Grace and Peace be yours!

According to BSUC's Governance Manual, oversight of, and decisions respecting, the day-to-day operations of the church is the assigned responsibility of the Lead Minister.

As it was I who effected the church building's closure (to all but essential staff and key volunteers) on March 18th, it likewise befalls me to ascertain when and how we will re-open.

Notwithstanding Premier Ford's announcement that faith communities *may* resume both worship gatherings (as a percentage of maximum occupant capacity) and other general meetings (to a maximum of 10

Life at Bridge Street United Church (Belleville, ON) during COVID-19 12 June 2020 socially distanced participants) as at this Friday, there are a number of issues to settle before I can and will (in all good conscience) declare the church's physical plant ready and able to accommodate in-person assembling.

Related to re-opening the church building is consideration of what the mechanics of worship will look like given the need for a clean and sanitized sanctuary (or Sills Auditorium) after every gathering, the need for socially distanced seating, the absence of singing, the suspended social time after the service, the possible necessity for worship participants to wear face masks and gloves, etc.

To assist me in my decision making, I invite you to forward your thoughts about when we should return to in-person worship, along with any other considerations that you believe I would do well to be mindful of. Please email me at <u>interim.clergy@gmail.com</u>.

I truly hope that you will add your voice to those others who will offer me their counsel.

The deadline for your submission is: June 17, 2020 at noon.

To allow for your input to reach me, and to provide time for its careful consideration before any action is taken, <u>the church building will remain</u> <u>closed</u> to all but essential staff and key volunteers (working on our meal programme) <u>until at least July 3rd</u>.

Between now and then worship will continue to be offered via the internet.

I appreciate that this news may not be satisfactory to some, while for others it will seem prudent. Unfortunately, such is an inevitability whenever problem solving is attempted.

Regardless of your position, please remember the often repeated phrase "We're all in this together", and couple it, if you will, with this hope filled sentiment 'Let's all get out of this together... and well!'
