The Worship & Music Team encourages your participation and encourages you to make arrangements for the needed provisions (however you define and wish to use them).




On September 17th, the Strategic Planning Committee delivered a comprehensive update about their work via electronic and land-based mail.

Our congregation is blessed to have a completely anonymous cluster of folk who are committed to be in prayer intentionally whenever a request is made.


