

Study Shows Monetary Impact of Faith

IS IT possible to put a price on faith? The Halo Canada Project — which has been tackling this question for the past five years, with research in over 80 congregations around the country — released a study in May showing that faith communities contribute \$15.5 billion to the national economy each year.

"When we explain that for every dollar congregations spend, the wider community gets back \$3.85, that's something that somebody in the neighbourhood can understand and see that it's having tangible value," says Mike Wood Daly, director of the project.

The dollar amount includes ways churches give directly to their communities, such as offering parking; acting like recreational centres, daycares or schools; building affordable housing; helping new immigrants and refugees settle; and even contributing to storm management through their green spaces.

Halo Canada also worked on a report with EDGE, the United Church's network for ministry development. Released in February, the report shows that the United Church alone contributes \$1.6 billion annually to the economy.

EDGE executive director Rob Dalgleish says that being able to quantify this impact is crucial for congregations looking to raise money from local stakeholders, who want to know how their donations will be put to good use.

"Inherently, people can see the good that's happening within their own community of faith," adds Carla Leon, new initiatives manager at EDGE. "They can feel the social and spiritual impact they're making in the neighbourhood. But to see it concretely as a number, I think it's really validating."

LETTER TO THE CONGREGATION ...

To the members of the Bridge Street United Church Congregation

From the Meal Program Leadership Team

On Upgrades to the Gymnasium, Corridor Toilet, and Former Infant /Toddler Rooms

We have recently received a generous grant from the John M & Bernice Parrott Foundation to upgrade parts of the 1962 addition to the church.

The Meal Programs have not been able to offer meals inside in the gym since March 2020 because of the risk of inter-person COVID transmission in a poorly-ventilated space. An energy recovery ventilation system, designed and mechanically engineered for the dimensions and location of the gymnasium will be installed in the gym roof. The ventilation upgrade, when functioning in conjunction with public health measures, shall assist immensely in making the room COVID-safe for gatherings and meals.

Those of us who have lunched or met in the gym in the past are very aware of the echoes and difficulty in any spoken or amplified communications there. The Parrott grant is also funding the installation of sound baffling material on sufficient of the gym wall area to improve the capacity for verbal communication and sound amplification in the space.

The Faith Formation Team is consolidating space for in-church children and youth activities to the Children's Centre. As a result of that decision, usable space in the corridor and adjacent rooms leading to the gym is being freed up for alternate use. The Governance Board has approved the suggested renovation and upgrades of the two small toilets, the infant and toddler rooms. This work is also being funded by the Parrott grant. Upgraded washrooms with barrier-free access to toilets and showers, and a laundry area with two sets of stacked washer/dryers will be created.

A time estimate for obtaining the ventilation supplies and equipment, then installation and renovations is 12-16 weeks +/-, thus, end February into March 2021. When the upgrades are completed, the church facility could be made available to meet community needs.
