A WARM "HUG" WITH PRAYERS KNIT INTO EVERY STITCH...

In Knitter's United convenor Elizabeth Ewashki's Update #15 to fellow knitters, she states, "As the pandemic continues, we have found ourselves if anything more in tune with our fellow knitters. We needed each other in new ways and many have reached out to others in support of many kinds. Thank you each for these kindnesses."

Veronica Leonard's response to Elizabeth's e-mail is noted below:

When I was in BGH in January with COVID, the negative air system they use in COVID patients' rooms was never warm enough, except when I was sitting looking out the window under a shawl my daughter gave me years ago. As soon as I was discharged from hospital, I started plans to knit a prayer shawl (with Elizabeth's advice and encouragement). All of the yarn I used was from KU donated wools, and for 2 1/2 months I knit and prayed into the coloured bands of stitches. Two weeks ago I approached the Manager of BGH's fifth floor and asked if I could donate it to a COVID patient who, like me, was continually cold. She was happy to accept it. Chances are it would only go to one patient, and it would either be taken home or discarded, but for ten days, at the lowest point in someone's illness, it would have served its purpose to help someone. Veronica goes



on to say "there are a lot of mistakes, quite a few dropped stitches and my own pattern that just sort of grew as I knit. I have never knit something this size before so for me it's been a real accomplishment." (You will be pleased to hear that Veronica states she has "recovered with very little repercussions from the COVID" (virus)).

These then are the words accredited to Jesus:
